Paul's Shipwreck at Malta: Acts 27:1-43

"The ship hit a sandbar and ran aground. The bow of the ship stuck fast, while the stern was exposed to the violence of the waves and began to break apart."

Acts 27:41 (TLB)

WHAT CAUSES PEOPLE TO MAKE POOR CHOICES THAT LEAD TO SETBACKS & STORMS?

WHEN WE

"Much time had been lost, and sailing had already become dangerous because by now it was after the Day of Atonement. So Paul warned them, 'Men, I can see that our voyage is going to be disastrous and bring great loss to ship and cargo, and to our own lives also" Acts 27:9-10 (NIV)

"But the officer in charge of the prisoners listened more to the ship's captain and the owner than to Paul." Acts 27:11 (NLT)

WHEN WE

sail on, hoping to reach Phoenix and winter there. This was a harbor in Crete, facing both southwest and northwest." Acts 27:12 (NIV)

WHEN WE

"When a gentle wind from the south started blowing, the men thought it was a good time to do what they had planned. So they pulled up the anchor, and we sailed along the coast of Crete." Acts 27:13 (CEV)

"But shortly afterwards the weather changed abruptly, and a heavy wind of typhoon strength (a "northeaster." they called it) caught the ship and blew it out to sea." Acts 27:14 (TLB)

WHAT DO I NEED TO KNOW ABOUT STORMS?

1. STORMS CAN

"The wind carried the ship away, and we couldn't sail against the wind. We couldn't do anything, so we were carried along by the wind." Acts 27:15 (GW)

"They tied ropes around the ship to hold it together." Acts 27:17 (NCV)

2. STORMS CAN

"The next day, as gale-force winds continued to batter the ship, the crew began throwing all the cargo overboard. The following day they even took some of the ship's gear and threw it overboard." Acts 27:18-19 (NLT)

3. STORMS CAN

"The terrible storm raged for many days, blotting out the sun and the stars, until at last all hope was gone." Acts 27:20 (NLT)

WHAT SHOULD I REMEMBER WHEN IT FEELS HOPELESS?

How Can I Anchor My Life in a Storm?

1ST ANCHOR: THE PRESENCE OF GOD

REMEMBER

"Finally. Paul called the crew together and said, 'Men, if you had listened to me . . . you would have avoided all this damage and loss. But take courage! None of you will lose your lives, even though the ship will go down. For last night an angel of the God to whom I belong and whom I serve stood beside me." Acts 27:21-23 (NIV)

2ND ANCHOR: THE PURPOSE OF GOD

REMEMBER

(Paul) "and he said, 'Don't be afraid, Paul, for you will surely stand trial before Caesar! What's more. God in his goodness has granted safety to everyone sailing with you." Acts 27:24 (NLT)

3RD ANCHOR: THE PROMISE OF GOD

REMEMBER

"So keep up your courage, men, for I have faith in God that it will happen just as he told me. Nevertheless, we must run aground on some island." Acts 27:25-26 (NIV)

"And as the sailors were seeking to escape from the ship, and had lowered the ship's boat into the sea under pretense of laying out anchors from the bow, Paul said to the centurion and the soldiers, "Unless these men stay in the ship, you cannot be saved." Then the soldiers cut away the ropes of the ship's boat and let it go." Acts 27:30-32 (ESV)

"Now I urge you to take some food. You need it to survive. Not one of you will lose a single hair from his head.' After he said this, he took some bread and gave thanks to God in front of them all. Then he broke it and began to eat. They were all encouraged." Acts 27:34-36 (NIV)

"the officer, wanted to let Paul live and did not allow the soldiers to kill the prisoners. Instead he ordered everyone who could swim to jump into the water first and swim to land. 44 The rest were to follow using wooden boards or pieces of the ship. "King Ahab told his wife Jezebel everything Elijah had done and how he put all the prophets of Baal. She sent this message to Elijah: 'May my gods strike me dead if by this time tomorrow I don't do the same thing to you that you did to the prophets.' Elijah was afraid and fled for his life; he took his servant and went to Beersheba in Judah. Leaving the servant there. Elijah walked a whole day into the wilderness. He stopped and sat down in the shade of a tree and wished he would die. 'It's too much, Lord,' he prayed. 'Take away my life; I might as well be dead!' He lay down under the tree and fell asleep' . . . He answered, "Lord God Almighty, I have always served you—you alone. But the people of Israel have broken their covenant with you, torn down your altars, and killed all your prophets. I am the only one left—and they are trying to kill me!"" 1 Kings 19:1-5, 10 (GNT)

HOW DOES GOD REFILL MY EMOTIONAL TANK?

1. GOD MAKES ME

But as he was sleeping, an angel touched and told him, '<u>Get up and eat!</u>' He looked around and there beside his head was some bread baked on hot stones and a jar of water! So he <u>ate and drank and laid down again.</u> Then the angel of the LORD came again and touched him and said, 'Get up and eat some more, or the journey ahead will be too much for you.' So Elijah got up and ate and drank, and the food gave him enough strength." 1 Kings 19:5-8 (NLT)

2. GOD ENCOURAGES ME

"Next, Elijah traveled 40 days to get to Mount Sinai, the mountain of God. There he came to a cave, where he spent the night. But the Lord said to him, 'What are you doing here, Elijah?' Then Elijah said." 1 Kings 19:8-9 (NLT)

3. GOD TELLS ME

""Go out and stand before me on the mountain,' the LORD told him. And as Elijah stood there, the LORD passed by, and a mighty windstorm hit the mountain . . . but the Lord was not in the wind. After the wind there was an earthquake, but the Lord was not in the earthquake. And after the earthquake there was a fire, but the Lord was not in the fire. And after the fire there was the sound of a gentle whisper. When Elijah heard it, he wrapped his face in his cloak and went out and stood at the entrance of the cave. And a voice said, 'What are you doing here, Elijah?'" 1 Kings 19:11-13 (NLT)

"At last the wall was completed to half its original height around the entire city—for the workers worked hard. But when Sanballat and Tobiah and the Arabians, Ammonites, and Ashdodites heard that the work was going right ahead and that the breaks in the wall were being repaired, they became furious. They plotted to lead an army against Jerusalem to bring about riots and confusion. But we prayed to our God and guarded the city day and night to protect ourselves. Then some of the leaders began complaining that the workmen were becoming tired; and there was so much rubble to be removed that we could never get it done by ourselves. Meanwhile, our enemies were planning to swoop down upon us and kill us, thus ending our work. And whenever the workers who lived in the nearby cities went home for a visit, our enemies tried to talk them out of returning to Jerusalem." Nehemiah 4:6-12 (TLB)

WHEN OTHERS KEEP SETTING YOU BACK

How God Turns Setbacks into Comebacks Rick Warren

Genesis 37-50

Much of Joseph's life included a series of painful setbacks from his dream to do great things with his life. But God used them to position Joseph for a spectacular comeback that saved 2 entire nations: Israel & Egypt

1st SETBACK: GROWING UP IN A HOME WHERE HE WAS

"Jacob loved Joseph more than any of his other children because Joseph had been born to him in his old age. So, one day Jacob had a special gift made for Joseph—a beautiful robe. But his brothers hated Joseph because their father loved him more than the rest of them. They couldn't say a kind word to him. One night Joseph had a dream, and when he told his brothers about it, they hated him more than ever."

Genesis 37:3-5 (NLT)

2nd SETBACK:"When Joseph's saw him coming, they recognized him in the distance. As he approached, they made plans to kill him. 'Here comes the dreamer!' they said. Come on, let's kill him and throw him into one of these cisterns. We can tell our father, "A wild animal has eaten him." Then we'll see what becomes of his dreams!"

Genesis 37:18-20 (NLT)

"Reuben heard them and tried to save Joseph. 'Let's not kill him,' he said. 'Just throw him into this well in the wilderness, but don't hurt him.' He said this, planning to save him from them and send him back to his father. When Joseph came up to his brothers, they ripped off his long robe with full sleeves. Then they took him and threw him into the well, which was dry." Genesis 37:21-24 (GNT)

3rd SETBACK:

"Then they sat down to eat. And looking up they saw a caravan of Ishmaelites coming from Gilead, with their camels bearing gum, balm, and myrrh, on their way to carry it down to Egypt. Then Judah said to his brothers, "What profit is it if we kill our brother and conceal his blood? Come, let us sell him to the Ishmaelites, and let not our hand be upon him, for he is our brother, our own flesh.' And his brothers listened to him. Then Midianite traders passed by. And they drew Joseph up and lifted him out of the pit, and sold him to the Ishmaelites for twenty shekels of silver. They took Joseph to Egypt." Genesis 37:26-28 (ESV)

4th SETBACK:

"Then the brothers killed a goat and spattered its blood on Joseph's coat, and took the coat to their father and asked him to identify it. 'We found this in the field,' they told him. 'Is it Joseph's coat or not?' Their father recognized it at once. 'Yes,' he sobbed, 'it is my son's coat. A wild animal has eaten him. Joseph is without doubt torn in pieces.' Then Israel tore his garments and put on sackcloth and mourned for his son in deepest mourning for many weeks. His family all tried to comfort him, but it was no use. 'I will die in mourning for my son,' he would say, and then break down and cry." Genesis 37:31-35 (TLB)

5th SETBACK:

"Meanwhile, in Egypt, the traders sold Joseph to Potiphar, an officer of the Pharaoh the king of Egypt." Genesis 37:36 (TLB)

6th SETBACK:

notice of Joseph and said. 'Come to bed with me!' But he refused. 'With me in charge.' he told her, '... How then could I do such a wicked thing and sin against God?' And though she spoke to Joseph day after day, he refused to go to bed with her or even be with her. One day he went into the house to attend to his duties, and none of the household servants was inside. She caught him by his cloak and said, 'Come to bed with me!' But he left his cloak in her hand and ran out of the house. When she saw that he had left his cloak in her hand and had run out of the house, she called her household servants. 'Look,' she said to them, 'this Hebrew has been brought to us to make sport of us! He came in here to sleep with me, but I screamed. When he heard me scream for help, he left his cloak beside me and ran out of the house.' She kept his cloak beside her until his master came home . . . When his master heard the story his wife told him, saying, 'This is how your slave treated me,' he burned with anger. Joseph's master took him and put him in prison." Genesis 39:6-20

7th SETBACK:
Story of Pharaoh's Wine Steward & Baker; Genesis 40:1-23:

"Then Joseph said to him, ' . . . Only remember me, when it is well with you, and please do me the kindness to mention me to Pharaoh, and so get me out of this house. For I was indeed stolen out of the land of the Hebrews, and here also I have done nothing that they should put me into the pit.' . . . Yet the chief cupbearer did not remember Joseph, but forgot him." Genesis 40:12-15, 23 (ESV)

WHAT MADE JOSEPH SO RESILIENT?

"Jacob's sons became jealous of Joseph and sold him to be a slave in Egypt. But God was with him and saved him from all his troubles." Acts 7:9-10 (NCV)

"Now Joseph had been taken down to Egypt. An Egyptian named Potiphar was an officer to the king of Egypt and the captain of the palace guard. He bought Joseph from the Ishmaelites who had brought him down there. The Lord was with Joseph, and he became a successful man. He lived in the house of his master."

Genesis 39:1-2 (NCV)

AT POTIPHAR'S

"Potiphar noticed this and realized that the Lord was with Joseph, giving him success in everything he did. This pleased Potiphar, so he soon made Joseph his personal attendant. He put him in charge of his entire household and everything he owned. From the day Joseph was put in charge of his master's household and property, the Lord began to bless Potiphar's household for Joseph's sake."

Genesis 39:3-5 (NLT)

IN PRISON

"So he took Joseph and threw him into the prison where the king's prisoners were held, and there he remained. <u>But the Lord was with Joseph</u> in the prison and showed him his faithful love. And the Lord made Joseph a favorite with the prison warden. Before long, the warden put Joseph in charge of all the other prisoners and over everything that happened in the prison." Genesis 39:20-22 (NLT)

"The jailer did not worry about anything, because the <u>Lord was with Joseph</u> and made him successful in all that he did." Genesis 39:23 (CEV)

"Joseph said to them, 'Don't be afraid. Am I in the place of God? You planned evil against me; God planned it for good to bring about the present result—the survival of many people." Genesis 50:19-20 (CSB)

"The king said to him, 'I have had a dream, and no one can explain it. I have been told that you can interpret dreams.' Joseph answered, 'I cannot, Your Majesty, but God will give a favorable interpretation." Genesis 41:15-16 (GNT)

"And the king asked them, 'Can we find a better man than Joseph to take this job? God's spirit is truly in him!' So the king said to Joseph, 'God has shown you all this. There is no one as wise and understanding as you are, so I will put you in charge of my palace. All the people will obey your orders, and only I will be greater than you.' Then the king said to Joseph, 'Look! I have put you in charge of all the land of Egypt.' Then the king took off from his own finger his ring with the royal seal on it, and he put it on Joseph's finger. He gave Joseph fine linen clothes to wear, and he put a gold chain around Joseph's neck . . . The king said to him, 'I am the king, and I say that no one in all the land of Egypt may lift a hand or a foot without your permission." Genesis 41:38-44 (NCV)

FOUR CHOICES I MUST MAKE IN ORDER TO FULFILL GOD'S PURPOSE & PLAN FOR MY LIFE

1. I MUST

"This is the account of Noah and his descendants. Noah had God's approval and was a man of integrity among the people of his time." Genesis 6:9 (GW)

"Now the earth was <u>corrupt</u> in God's sight, and the earth was filled with <u>violence</u>. And God saw the earth, and behold, it was corrupt, for all flesh had corrupted their way on the earth." Genesis 6:11-12 (ESV)

"The Lord saw that the wickedness of man was great in the earth, and that <u>every</u> <u>intention</u> of the thoughts of his heart was only evil continually. And the Lord regretted that he had made man on the earth, and it grieved him to his heart."

Bring a pair of every kind of animal—a male and a female—into the boat with you to keep them alive during the flood . . . And be sure to take on board enough food for your family and for all the animals.' So Noah did everything exactly as God had commanded him."
