The Bible teaches everything you need to know to be saved and to grow in your relationship with God. To begin a relationship with Jesus, there are just a few simple truths you need to understand.

1. To know and love God, you need to confess your sin. He is faithful to forgive when you come to him with a humble heart.

"But if we confess our sins to God, he can always be trusted to forgive us and take our sins away" (1 John 1:9 CEV).

2. You must believe that Jesus died to pay for your sins and that he was raised to life on Easter.

"If you declare with your mouth, 'Jesus is Lord,' and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved" (Romans 10:9 NIV).

3. Our relationship to God is not restored by anything we do but by what Jesus has done for us. You have to accept God's free gift of salvation.

"For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this not from yourselves, it is the gift of God—not by works, so that no one can boast" (Ephesians 2:8-9 NIV).

4. When Jesus is Lord of your life, it means he calls the shots in every area. You invite him to be your guide through life so you can follow his will.

"Look! I stand at the door and knock. If you hear my voice and open the door, I will come in" (Revelation 3:20 NLT).

If you're ready to begin a relationship with Jesus, then you can pray this prayer:

Dear God, you have promised that if I believe in your Son, Jesus Christ, everything I've ever done wrong will be forgiven. I will be accepted into your family and into an eternal home in heaven with you one day.

I confess that I have sinned, and I ask for your forgiveness. I believe that Jesus died to pay for my sins and that he was raised to life. I trust in Jesus as my Savior and will follow him as Lord of my life. Please guide me and help me to do your will. In Jesus' name I pray. Amen.
